OUR SERVICE

The Whyalla Regional Domestic Violence Service provides access to crisis and transitional accommodation with individualised in-centre and outreach case management support for persons referred or self-presenting, who are escaping or are experiencing Domestic and/or Aboriginal family violence.

We provide a range of services:

- Confidential intake.
- Safety, risk and needs assessment.
- Safety Planning.
- Referral to specialised housing programs with client-centered, trauma-informed case management support.
- Referral to other housing providers or other specialised services.
- Information, advocacy and advice.

ELIGIBILITY

All persons, either alone or with accompanying children who are escaping or experiencing domestic or Aboriginal family violence.

REFERRALS

Referrals are accepted via phone or presentation to office from individuals, families and other service providers.

The service operates 9am to 5pm, Monday to Friday (except for Public Holidays).
