MALVERN PLACE and COOLOCK HOUSE

Malvern Place and Coolock House provide support and accommodation for young mothers up to the age of 25 who are pregnant or parenting, and their children.

Support is tailored to meet specific needs and help young families achieve their goals as part of individualised case management.

Malvern Place and Coolock House both provide six self-contained units onsite with Family Support Workers available on a 24/7 basis.

- Specialised Children's Worker is available to support the needs of children
- Support to access and maintain medium-term and long-term accommodation
- Pregnancy and parenting support, assistance to develop independent living skills and achieve personal goals
- Information and connection to community

COST

- A weekly accommodation fee applies. Clients are responsible for their electricity and food

LOUISE PLACE

Louise Place provides support and accommodation for young mothers 18 years and under, who are pregnant or parenting, and are experiencing homelessness or are at risk of homelessness.

Support is provided to young mothers and children to achieve their goals and meet their needs as part of individualised case management.

Louise Place provides eight self-contained units onsite at Fullarton with Family Support Workers available on a 24/7 basis.

- Specialised Children's Worker is available to support the needs of children
- Support to access and maintain medium-term and long-term accommodation for young mothers up to the age of 25 years
- Pregnancy and parenting support, assistance to develop independent living skills and achieve personal goals
- Information and links to community

COST

- There is a weekly accommodation fee and a contribution for utilities cost
- Clients are responsible for their food

FINDON FAMILY HOUSING

Medium-term accommodation to young mothers and/or fathers up to the age of 25 years, who are pregnant or parenting and are experiencing homelessness or are at risk of homelessness, but who have low need support requirements.

- All genders welcome
- Support is provided to young parents and children to achieve their goals and meet their needs as part of individualised case management
- Support to access long-term accommodation
- Pregnancy and parenting support, assistance to develop independent living skills and achieve personal goals
- Information and links to community

COST

- Rent charged weekly by SA Housing Authority. Rent is set at 25% of gross household income
- A two-week deposit is required
- Families are responsible for their utilities and living expenses
